V/C highlighted five areas National is striving for. 1. Most importantly is Governance. USPS is aiming to simplify the bureaucracy that occurs in non-profit organizations. The goal is to include leaders from the recreational boating industry and corporate world as a part of the Board of Directors. 2. Financial Integrity has been revived after two years of hard work. The first year was approximately \$36,000 in the black with the second year indicating \$173,161 revenue over expenses. 3. Membership Recruitment and Retention. He made two recommendations for squadrons. Squadrons should consider adding the cost of a year’s membership to the price of their Public Boating Course and to allow on line membership applications and dues. 4. USPS University continues to our strength for the future. Advanced Grades are up. 5. Enhance Communication with a new publication of USPS, “The Compass”, electronic merit marks, and the Ships Store web site.
